NURSING COURSES

The MSN in Nursing Administration degree program is 12 courses, 5 or 10 weeks in length, for a total of 36 credit hours. Students receive a personalized degree plan that determines the order in which courses are taken.

N5301 Research

Exploration of the research process and critical examination of published studies with emphasis on research critique, interpretation of statistical results, and evidence-based practice.

N5327 Theory

Critical examination of the philosophical and theoretical bases for nursing. Analysis of selected concepts and theories.

*N5328 Theory & Research Application

Integration of theoretical and empirical elements of nursing research with emphasis on proposal development.

*N5311 Nursing Management

Considers development of management and organizational theories as applied to healthcare organizations and their environment.

N5343 Leadership and Complex Healthcare Systems

Analyze leadership strategies in current and predicted healthcare systems including dimensions of workforce and workplace issues, leadership, and evidence-based decision making.

*N5382 Nursing and Healthcare Policy

Analyze historical, current, and predicted national, state, and local healthcare policy processes.

N5341 Financial Management

(45 clinical project hours)
Analyze and apply financial management concepts to financial planning, budgeting, and reimbursement systems in healthcare.

N5342 Management of Nursing Operations

(45 clinical project hours)
Strategic planning for healthcare systems.

N5340 Management Seminar

(90 preceptored hours required) Synthesize management, organizational and leadership concepts and theories in selected healthcare settings.

*N5339 Role of Administrator A & B

(90 preceptored hours required) Examine and implement roles and functions of the administrative executive and managers in healthcare organizations.

*These courses are conducted over two 5-week periods.
