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NURSING COURSES

The MSN in Nursing Education program requires a total of 39 credit hours which can be completed in as few as 24 months. Courses are delivered in 5 or 10 week formats.

NURS5301 Research in Nursing

Exploration of the research process and critical examination of published studies with emphasis on research critique, interpretation of statistical results, and evidence-based practice.

NURS5327 Analysis of Theories for Nursing

Critical examination of philosophical and theoretical bases for nursing. Analysis of selected concepts and theories.

NURS5328 Theory and Research Application in Nursing

Integration of theoretical and empirical elements of nursing research with emphasis on proposal development.

NURS5329 Role of the Nurse Educator

Investigation of the roles and functions of the nurse educator.

NURS5302 Curriculum Development and Evaluation

Explore the nature of nursing education. Focus on the curriculum process and its application to nursing education programs.

NURS5308 Nursing Informatics

Focus on application of computer technology that supports the dissemination of healthcare data, information and knowledge. Selected software packages/applications are presented and used.

NURS5319 Advanced Pharmacology for Nurse Educators

Study of clinical pharmacological therapeutics for nurse educators

NURS5309 Teaching / Learning Theories, Strategies, and Evaluation

Teaching/learning theories, strategies, and evaluations for educators.

NURS5318 Advanced Pathophysiology

for Nurse Educators

This course focuses on developing an advanced knowledge base of pathophysiology. Principles of advanced physiology and pathophysiology and are applied to disease processes.

NURS5360 Simulation Application in Nursing

Application of simulation and active learning strategies in nursing education.

NURS5361 Special Topics in Clinical Practice

(45 clinical project hours)

Advanced clinical practice with selected targeted patient populations.

NURS5362 Nursing Education Practicum

(120 preceptored hours required)
Nursing education preceptorship in selected healthcare sites with opportunities to apply clinical and educational knowledge, skills, and concepts in a guided, progressive context of nursing education.

NURS5326 Advanced Assessment for Nurse Educators

Apply theoretical foundations and clinical skills in comprehensive health assessment across the lifespan as applies to the nurse educator role.

- Current US Registered Nurse (RN) License
- Successful completion of a Bachelor of Science, with a major in Nursing
- Undergraduate statistics course
- Two years of US-based clinical experience
- Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL) or International English as a Foreign Language (IELTS) may apply
- 2.8 GPA required; GRE Scores required if GPA is below 3.0
